Dr. Joshua Feder is a child and family psychiatrist in Solana Beach, California. As programmatic Lead for the International Network on Peace Building with Young Children, Dr. Feder has worked as a Senior Consultant since 2013 with the Early Years: The Organisation for Young Children in Northern Ireland, developing programs to support resilience in children and families impacted by conflict.

Dr. Feder teaches and conducts research with UCSD, SDSU, An Najah National University, and Fielding Graduate University in infant and early childhood development. He develops technology supporting relationship-based interventions as Medical Director in the SymPlay division of Quicksilver Software and serves on the development team for the Disabilities and Autism Is inclusion program.

Dr. Feder's is actively involved in media work, including the Graphic Medicine community, and his podcast team at Carlat publishing has over 4 million downloads.

Dr. Feder's recent books include the *Child Medication Fact Book for Psychiatric Practice*, Second Edition (2023), Foundations for a Peaceful World: The Transformative Power of Early Childhood Education to Promote Peace and Social Cohesion (2023) and Supporting the Mental Health of Migrant Children, Youth, and Families (2024).

In my current practice I see infant, children, adolescents, and adults in a family-oriented practice where about half of the people have difficulties with development, relating, communicating, and learning, mainly Autism and related challenges, and the other half have more typical neurobehavioral or psychiatric difficulties such as Bipolar Disorder, Tourette's Syndrome, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Depression, Anxiety, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, and others. This includes conducting and supervising Intensive Behavioral Interventions for infants and young children through adolescents and adults with autism and other developmental disorders (1992 - present); treatment of chronically institutionalized children, adolescents and adults (1990 - present); treatment of VIP patients and families in the mental health system (1986 - present); and forensic work, often related to questions pertaining to developmental challenges or trauma.

4. RESEARCH, TECHNOLOGY, AND SCHOLARLY WORK:

Academic Publishing

Dr. Feder's academic career has been a continuous part of his medical career, with teaching and research at several universities and programs, and publication of co-authored articles and books. Much of Dr. Feder's work has focused on trauma, autism and related areas, with recent expansion since 2017 of articles, webinars and podcasts (click the web linked titles below and in the media section) in his role as Editor in Chief at the Carlat Child Psychiatry Report, a division of Carlat Publishing, which is marked by its independence from industry influence. Dr. Feder publishes about thirty peer reviewed articles annually, covering a range of topics in child and adolescent mental health. Dr. Feder has co-authored and co-edited a number of peer-reviewed books covering child and adult psychopharmacology, peace building through early childhood education, and mental health care for migrant and refugee children and teens.

Research:

Dr Feder conducts research focused on assessment and treatment of autistic children, adolescents, and young adults and those with other developmental challenges, including socialization and workability, with landmark publications relating to the field. One such publication was the 1999 first Practice Parameters For The Assessment And Treatment Of Children, Adolescents, And Adults With Autism And Other Pervasive Developmental Disorders by the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Another landmark article is the 2024 <u>Developmental Relationship Based Intervention for Autistic Children</u> that defines the field for clinicians families researchers and payors (open access). Dr: Feder's most recent research in autism is focused on functional and symptomatic outcomes of the Positive Development Model, a Developmental Relationship-Based approach which is demonstrating meaningful impact for autistic children, teens, and young adults and their families across a range of levels of disability and social determinants.

Dr Feder's research and publications include work with populations impacted by trauma in the US, Northern Ireland, and the Middle East. He is actively involved in research on helping families living in distressed communities to become more resilient through helping their parents and caregivers to be more responsive and less harsh. Dr. Feder's matched controlled trial of his program, the Early Years Media Initiative for Children Revised Toddler Module: Building Social-Emotional Resilience, demonstrated meaningful improvements in social emotional function among toddlers in Northern Ireland and reduced stress in staff and parents. He and his team are currently applying for a Peace Plus grant to spread the program across the entire country and the six bordering counties of the Republic of Ireland.

5. ADVOCACY: Resource Development, Legislative, Forensic, Policy, and Peace Building

Forensic Services:

Dr. Feder engages in forensic assessment and testimony for family court, criminal court, disability, educational planning, and related proceedings. Dr Feder's forensic work frequently involves questions about autism and other developmental challenges, and in particular cases of alleged sexual abuse and other trauma, working both on behalf of plaintiffs as well defendants. Beyond these areas, Dr Feder's cases have included a class action suit with the East Los Angeles Regional Center securing access to evidence-based care for persons with autism and related developmental challenges; one of the first Laura's Law cases in California to secure outside oversight for persons with recurrent severe psychiatric illness; one of the first Mental Health Diversion cases in California to offer treatment instead of prison on a series of felony offenses committed due to a severe mental health condition; the first known long term Electroconvulsive Therapy case in San Diego County for life threatening medical illness; and a successful attempted murder defense in New Jersey for a person with developmental disabilities.

Dr Feder has specific and extensive qualifications for forensic psychiatric work with persons with developmental challenges and trauma. He is a medical doctor currently licensed to practice medicine in California, Colorado, The District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, and Virginia. Dr Feder is the Executive Medical Director of Positive Development, a national company providing in home and community services for autistic children and adolescents and their families.

Dr Feder is trained as a child and adolescent psychiatrist, board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in both General Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, later serving in faculty roles teaching child and adolescent psychiatry and related topics related to assessment and treatment of developmental disorders and research methodology at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, the University of California at San Diego School of Medicine Department of Psychiatry, and Fielding Graduate University Department of Psychology Program in Infant and Early Childhood Development. For the past six years Dr Feder has served as the Editor in Chief of the Carlat Child Psychiatry Report, a continuing education publication in the field, where he has published numerous articles on autism, trauma, and related topics.

In addition to an active clinical practice, Dr Feder conducts research focused on assessment and treatment of autistic children, adolescents, and young adults and those with other developmental challenges, including socialization and workability, with several publications relating to the field. One such publication was the first Practice Parameters For The Assessment And Treatment Of Children, Adolescents, And Adults With Autism And Other Pervasive Developmental Disorders by the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.

In the field of psychiatric trauma, Dr Feder previously served on the review board for the journal Child Maltreatment, reviewing articles for publication; Dr Feder also served on the United States Navy Headquarters Child Sexual Abuse Team, based in Washington, DC, evaluating complex cases, often several years after the alleged incidents, and from locations in multiple cultural

contexts worldwide. Dr Feder served 16 years in the US Navy, regularly addressing psychiatric aspects of trauma in adults and children, and from the 1980's through to 2024 he has written and taught continuing education courses for healthcare professionals and first responders on the identification and management of psychological trauma.

Dr Feder's research and publications include work with populations impacted by trauma in the US, Northern Ireland, and the Middle East. He is actively involved in research on helping families living in distressed communities to become more resilient through helping their parents and caregivers to be more responsive and less harsh. Dr Feder's clinical work includes about fifty per cent patients with developmental challenges, and the other half includes highly complex neuropsychiatric challenges, many in each category with histories of trauma. Dr. Feder recently completed The American Institute for the Advancement of Forensic Studies - Clinical Forensic Neuroscience-Informed Practitioner Certificate.

Policy and Peace Building:

Dr. Feder has over 15 years of continuous experience in bipartisan policy development on the Middle East and mental health subject areas at State, Congressional and international levels. Dr. Feder's work includes program development and policy advocacy related to peace building in regions impacted by armed conflict, with research projects, or support in Northern Ireland, the Balkan region, Ukraine, and the Middle East.

Dr Feder serves as Programmatic Lead on the Executive Committee of the International Network on Peace Building with Young Children (INPB), a member of the Early Childhood Peace Consortium, developing educational programs for early childhood staff, parents and caregivers that are scalable for use across entire countries.

During the Trump administration Dr. Feder worked with the White House and the United States Senate Foreign Relations Committee on a bipartisan plan to ratify the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

In May 2021 Dr. Feder helped produce a joint international statement during the Hamas-Israel conflict calling for cessation of hostilities and attention to the needs of children impacted by the conflict.

In the fall of 2023 Dr Feder spoke at a high-level meeting of the 78th United Nations General Assembly, launching his book Foundations for a Peaceful World: The Transformative Power of Early Childhood Education to Promote Peace and Social Cohesion, and with the recent war has worked to develop trauma informed mental health care programs for all children impacted by the conflict.

In the summer of 2024, Dr. Feder helped negotiate a <u>statement</u> for the International Networking group on Peace Building with Young Children including members from Israel, Lebanon, and the Palestinian Authority calling for the protection of children during the ongoing regional war.


